

BRIDGE JUMPER CALLAHAN'S BODY

**An Inquest on the Remains Will Be
Held Next Saturday.**

POUGHKEEPSIE, N. Y., Oct. 28.—The remains of Patrick King Callahan, the plucky but unfortunate bridge jumper, were removed to-day from Highland to Clintondale. Coroner Hasbrouck impaneled a jury and viewed the remains this morning. The inquest will be held at Dean's Hotel, Highland, Saturday, at 1 P. M., and subpoenas will be issued for all who took part in the affair.

Callahan died alone except for Mr. Dean, proprietor of the hotel to which he was removed, and his wife and a stranger. If the body is not claimed it will be buried at Mr. Dean's expense. Dr. Lamore of Highland and Dr. Preston of Milton performed an autopsy this afternoon.

Much sympathy is expressed here for the unlucky Callahan. He was so plucky that he deserved a better fate. Coroner Hasbrouck says he will consult the District Attorney of Ulster County before determining what line of examination to follow at the inquest.
